

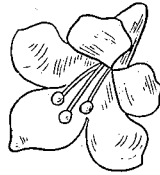

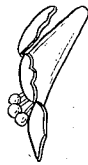

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, Carl Schraysshuen, a citizen of the United States, residing at Providence, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Jewelry Finding, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, constituting a part thereof.

Fig. 1 is a front elevation of a jewelry finding showing my new design;

Fig. 2 is a side elevation of the jewelry finding shown in Fig. 1; and

Fig. 3 is a rear elevation thereof.
